

SPANISH 21

The layout for Spanish 21 is very similar to a standard Blackjack layout. The only differences are: the felt identifies the game as Spanish 21, the Bonus 21 Payoffs are printed on the layout and the "Match the Dealer" bet is offered. Rule signs can be found on the table designated for Spanish 21.

The game is played with four decks. The only exception to the standard deck is that all number "10" cards are removed. (A Spanish deck of cards consists of Ace to 9, Jack, Queen, and King.)

HOW TO PLAY SPANISH 21

The game play of Spanish 21 is very similarly to traditional blackjack, however there are some important variations to point out.

Players may double down on two or more cards, as well as double down after splitting. Players can split cards of equal value, including aces, up to three times, creating four hands. When splitting, aces are treated like any other card (whereas in normal 21, aces may only be split once receiving only one card per ace.) Hitting and doubling down of split hands, including aces, is allowed. All 21's get paid automatically. A player Blackjack always beats a dealers Blackjack and is paid 3 to 2.

When the dealer's face up card is an ace or a face card, they check under the card for Blackjack. Insurance and late surrender are allowed. Insurance is a side bet that the dealer has 21 when showing an ace. Insurance may be taken for up to half the original Spanish 21 bet and pays 2 to 1. Surrender allows the player to forfeit half of their wager and drop from the hand. The player cannot surrender when the dealer has a blackjack or after taking a hit.

Another rule variation of Spanish 21 is the Double Down Rescue. If the player receives an unfavorable card after doubling down on any number of cards, the player may indicate to the dealer that they would like to Rescue their Double Down bet. The dealer will return the double down and the player forfeits their hand and original bet.

The dealer must hit soft 17 or less. A soft 17 is any combination of cards that equal seven or less with one of those cards being an Ace. When the sum of a hand is equal to 17 and includes a 10 value card, that is called hard 17 and the dealer stays.

BONUS 21 PAYOFFS

Certain player 21 totals result in a Bonus 21 Payoff. Bonuses are not paid on doubled hands.

BONUS 21 PAYOUTS

MATCH THE DEALER

Players can also make a Match the Dealer bet. In addition to the regular Spanish 21 bet, a player can bet that either of their first two cards, or both, will match the dealer's up card in rank. The Match the Dealer bet has a minimum of \$1 with a maximum of \$25.

MATCH THE DEALER PAYOUTS

1 non-suited match	4 to 1
2 non-suited matches	8 to 1
1 suited match	10 to 1
1 non-suited & 1 suited	14 to 1
2 suited matches	20 to 1

SUPER BONUS PAYOFF

The Super Bonus Payoff requires no special side bet. When a player's first three cards are suited 7s and the dealer's up card is any 7, the Super Bonus Payoff is paid.

Wagers of \$5-\$24 win a \$1,000 Super Bonus Payoff.

Wagers of \$25+ win \$5,000.

All other betting players of that round are paid a \$50 Envy Bonus regardless of wager amount.

The Super Bonus Payoff is void on doubled or split hands.

HOUSE RULES

Players may play more than one hand at supervisor's discretion. Side betting is strictly prohibited on the casino floor. All decisions made by the Floor Supervisor are final.

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
